



In conjunction with its newly established partnership with Good Shepherd Volunteers, Carnegie Mellon University's [H. John Heinz III College](#) is proud to announce the creation of the *Heinz College-Good Shepherd Scholarship*. Beginning in 2009, the Heinz College will award scholarships to incoming students in the [Master of Science in Public Policy and Management](#) (MSPPM) program who are Good Shepherd Volunteers/Alumni. The Heinz College will also select one of the Good Shepherd Volunteers/Alumni each year to receive a **full-tuition scholarship to attend the MSPPM program**.

In addition, the Heinz College will award partial tuition scholarships to all other Good Shepherd Volunteers/Alumni admitted to the MSPPM program or any of its other full-time master's degree programs in both the [School of Public Policy and Management](#) and the [School of Information Systems and Management](#). The award will be made at the time of admission (no separate application is necessary) and the Good Shepherd Volunteers/Alumni will receive at least \$6,000 per semester – most will receive more. To be considered, applicants should indicate their involvement with Good Shepherd Volunteers on the application for admission.

At the Heinz College, we aim to distinguish ourselves from other public policy graduate degree programs. So we created a curriculum that is focused on developing leadership, quantitative analysis and technology skills that no other institution can match. We offer a [one-year track](#) and a traditional [two-year track](#) in Pittsburgh. We also offer a two-year track split between [Pittsburgh and Washington, D.C.](#), with students spending one year in each city.
